As per section 11 of Indian Medical Council Rules, 1957, nomination are to be made on nomination paper in form No. I, which shall be supplied by the Returning Officer.

For the convenience of the Registered Medical Practitioners the Section 12 (1) of the Rules, under the heading Nomination Paper are reproduced below:

Each nomination paper shall be subscribed by two electors as proposer and seconder;

Provided that no elector shall subscribe more nominations than one;

Provided further that if more than one nomination paper be subscribed by the same elector, the nomination paper first received by the Returning Officer shall, if otherwise in order, be held to be valid and if more than one nomination paper signed by the same elector be received simultaneously by the Returning Officer all such nomination papers shall be held to be invalid.

The nominated candidate or their duly authorised representative may attend the process of scrutiny of nomination paper and counting of votes.
